Objective of the Visit:

Core Activities:

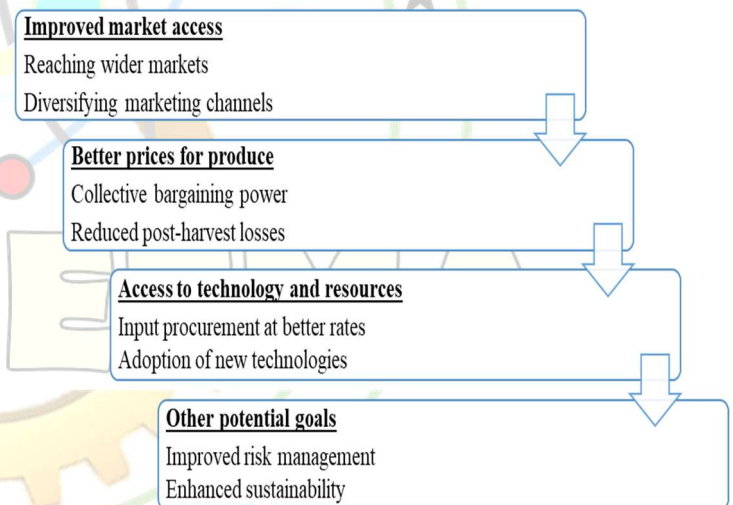
Aggregation and marketing:	NAFPCL helps its members by aggregating their produce, ensuring better bargaining power and access to fair prices in the market.
